





A collaborative exhibition between Videocity X Next Door **Records and Bush Hall.**

When we share food we share intimate moments. Our physical movements share unspoken languages and our memories are renewed through touch, taste and smell. Past events and fractured spaces appear before us again as ghosts, sometimes welcoming, sometimes not. These earlier experiences are not literally present in the current, but linger in the warmth of a reoccurring smell or the texture of a juicy fruit. When we consume food, our virtual affects, our expectations, imaginations, and fantasies contribute affectively. They shape the present event, be that a memory of off-milk souring the expectation of a hot chocolate, or the process of making jam bringing back childhood. Memories are more powerful in food choice than rational reason.

Food is a comfort, a memory you can keep, touch and care for also a marker of contradictions - of inclusion and exclusion, distance and closeness, of home, belonging and longing... so of pleasure and pain.

The works of artists and filmmakers Nia Fekri, Apolo Wilson, Ruth Maclennan, Laure Provoust, Gyonyyoung Yoon, Paul Birchall and Kollektiv Wirr, are evocative of these themes. Shown across the two sites on the busy Uxbridge road - an area brimming with diverse cuisines and stuffed with food related goods and culture - the windows become voyeuristic lenses. The works disrupt the publics' daily routines and grocery shopping trips; they allow the passers-by to watch the food related videos and peer beyond them, to the café customers and evening diners whose consumption frames the works sharing, chatting or dining alone in contemplation, having a drink or a bite to eat.

Summary:

The exhibition will showcase 7 international artists, both supporting local, London based, emerging artists and established artists. It is formed of 3 TV screens located in the windows of the venues. The relationship of memory to food is the focus of the curatorial selection.

An area that is both busy and diverse in audience, exhibitions, art viewings and particularly video art is unusual to be seen within the area. The Uxbridge road is a busy main road filled with a multitude of food varieties. The exhibition aims to attract passers by, opening a dialogue between local residents and local venues about food and memory, while showcasing the accomplished and far-reaching artists.

It also allows the audience to interact with the works without any concern over Covid-19, be it a street viewing. It is a free and accessible exhibition, adding colour, variation and curiosity to a busy London street.



Videocity is a non-profit public art project founded in Basel (CH) in 2013. It aims to bring video art to a broader audience, to public outdoor and other unusual locations, including an online archive accessible for free 24/7.

The team consists of Dr. Andrea Domesle, along with a young international team of mostly young women. The team is spread across Switzerland, Germany, Italy, France, San Marino, UK, China, the UAE and others.

Videocity is composed of thematic screening cycles on socially relevant topics. These screenings take place internationally and online.

As a not-for-profit cultural association, Videocity relies on grants and private engagement.

We rely on this support to fund our artists and the production of a new video or the design of a new exhibition by an emerging curator.

Initiator and curator

Dr. Andrea Domesle, MAS, has been renowned as a specialist in international and Swiss modern and contemporary art since the publication of her doctorate on "Leucht-Schrift-Kunst" by Reimer Verlag, in Berlin 1998). As a cultural manager, she specializes in the development and positioning of art projects. She lives in Basel and works as a curator, author and lecturer on art history, museum and curatorial studies and creative writing at universities in Switzerland and abroad. She has organized over 120 exhibitions, including 19 tours with 500 artists in Switzerland, Europe, Asia and the USA on socially relevant topics alone or with co-curators.
